

CRITERIA FOR IDENTIFYING MEMBERS OF SECTOR ADVISORY GROUPS

Members of Sector Advisory Groups **should have**:

- A wide range of expertise and experience across one or more of the Council's core operational areas (arts, education, English language teaching, governance and human rights, science and technology) OR one of the main cross-cutting areas such as ICT, cultural studies, media, knowledge and information, citizenship, development or gender studies
- Expertise and experience in relevant areas of international cultural relations and able to engage on broad range of subjects including the UK's Strategic International Priorities (SIPs)
- An understanding and knowledge of one of the main geographical regions in which the Council operates, arising from direct experience of working in a region or from experience of working with institutions or individuals in a region (Desirable).

In addition, they need to be currently working at a senior professional level in UK.
