British Council had previously partnered up with ACCESS4EU to bring deliver the Australian component of the initiative – AUS-ACCESS4EU. We would like to highlight that this project has now concluded and therefore the [website](#) will no longer be updated.

## Opportunities and Events

### [The 2012 International Convention on Science, Education and Medicine in Sport](#)

As 2012 is the year of the London Olympics, we thought we would highlight one event which shows how important researchers are to Sport. The International Olympic Committee (IOC), International Paralympic Committee (IPC), The International Olympic Committee (IOC), International Paralympic Committee (IPC), International Federation of Sports Medicine (FIMS) and the International Council of Sport Science and Physical Education (ICSSPE) have announced that their International Convention on Science, Education and Medicine in Sport will take place in Glasgow, **19 – 24 July**, just before the Opening Ceremonies for the 2012 Olympic Games.

ICSEMIS replaces and expands the scope of the former four-yearly Congresses that were so familiar to many scientists and academics in sport. The Convention will be an opportunity for leading researchers to understand each other's needs, gain knowledge from other disciplines and address issues in sport and society that can only be tackled through joint efforts. Researchers, students and practitioners from every branch of sport and exercise are invited to attend and to share this unique opportunity for multi-and interdisciplinary scientific exchange. The main theme of the Convention is: Inspiring a Learning Legacy.

### [UKIERI](#)

The UKIERI Innovation partnership calls are open for proposals. These aim to strengthen engagement between Indian and UK higher education institutions by facilitating collaborations between faculties and researchers along with promoting and assisting registered PhD students and post-docs in India and the UK to undertake short-term visits to work on research projects. The collaboration should involve staff and researcher exchanges between the UK and India, including for research students in all universities and research centres and teams in the UK and India. The partnerships will provide a maximum of £60,000 for partnerships of up to two years.

Under the Innovation Partnerships strand, there is a call open for trilateral partnerships between India, the UK and the US (TRIP). TRIP funds are available to support project proposals up to 2 years and the grants will provide up to a maximum of £50,000 during that time period. TRIP funding is designed to support the collaborative and developmental costs of a multidisciplinary research or academic collaborative projects.

The deadline for calls is **15 March 2012**.
