Create a song, rap or poem in another European language.

Write what you have created.

Look at the eTwinning map.

Memorise 10 European country flags and their capital cities.

Which countries did you memorise and what does their flag look like?

Can you name the countries where your clothes were made?

Make a list of eTwinning countries starting with each letter of the alphabet e.g. Armenia, Belgium,
