Introduction and Background to the project

Cultural Skills

This project is led by the Cultural Skills team (CS) which was set up to consolidate and develop the British Council's global cultural skills offer.

Collaborating with UK and international partners, CS's ambition is to realise the British Council's cultural relations mission by building sustainable capacity building programmes that ensure the cultural sector worldwide is equipped with highly skilled workers, who can contribute to mutual cultural and economic benefit.

International Museum Academy: Burma 2017

International Museum Academy: Burma 2017 is designed to build capacity in Burma's museum and education sector and form new relationships between UK and Burmese museums and universities.

Programme objectives:

- 1. development of the standard of collections documentation in Burma's museums
- 2. improvement to the documentation module of Yangon National Museum's diploma in Museum Studies
- 3. creation of a digital documentation model that enables Burmese museums to share their collections online

<u>Legacy</u>

In order for the programme to continue and develop beyond 2017, the British Council will seek to develop a consortium of partners to contribute to the sustainability of the programme. We are open to exploring different partnership, financial and business models, and would welcome a discussion with interested partners to find an equitable solution.



Specification

The British Council is inviting proposals for the content development and delivery of the following programme of activity in February 2017 in Burma. We are inviting you to tender with an approach which would accomplish this within a total budget of **15,000 GBP (+ VAT)**.

The proposed activity for two individuals from a UK institution to deliver is as follows:

a. **Documentation and Digitisation: short course** 21-25 February 2017

Develop and deliver the content for a practical five day CPD course that will teach 50 Burmese museum professionals how to accurately document and share their collections digitally

b. Documentation and Digitisation: toolkit

Deliver a toolkit (print-friendly in PDF format) to accompany the short course that will guide Burmese professionals through the step-by-step process of documenting objects digitally using SPECTRUM as a standard; this should be linked to a Google Docs site that will enable collections to be securely shared online

c. Yangon National Museum: Museum Studies diploma development

Advise and provide content to the Yangon National Museum in order for them to modernise the documentation module of their Museum Studies diploma

The fixed fee for this work is **15,000 GBP (+VAT)**:

NB: The Course Facilitator does not have to be an employee of the Course Leader's institution.



The short course participants will have a minimum of one years' experience in the museum sector, have responsibility for collection management in their institutions, and be in a position to implement what they have learnt.

Their English proficiency will be low, therefore a consecutive interpreter (<u>not simultaneous</u>) will provide translation during the course, as well as provide translation for the toolkit and Museum Studies diploma development.

A local museum adviser will also form part of the team in order to advise on content development and provide some translation support during the course and with the Museum Studies diploma.

The programme should:

- encourage arts professionals to develop new ways of thinking and working in museums
- increase the skills and expertise of museum professionals
- showcase examples of best practice in the UK museum sector
- create a network of emerging museum professionals

<u>Dates</u>

The short course will be delivered at Yangon National Museum in Burma from 21-25 February 2017.

The toolkit will be launched during the short course.

Development of the Museum Studies diploma should take place in the run up to the short course from late November to February.

Training Methods and Structure

The short course should be interactive, engaging and innovative. It should include:

- · taught sessions
- interactive group work
- hands-on activities and practical sessions
- presentations of case studies
- one-on-one sessions

Responsibilities

The responsibilities will be:

- to develop and deliver the activity outlined above
- to feed into the participant survey for the short course
- to liaise with the British Council CS Programme Manager and British Council Burma Project Manager



• to be available for calls at regular intervals between November 2016 – February 2017

CS will cover the cost of and have responsibility for:

- Managing the participant survey
- Liaising with the course participants
- Logistics (flights, accommodation, teaching venue, catering)
