

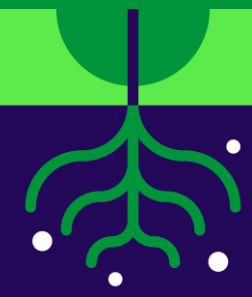

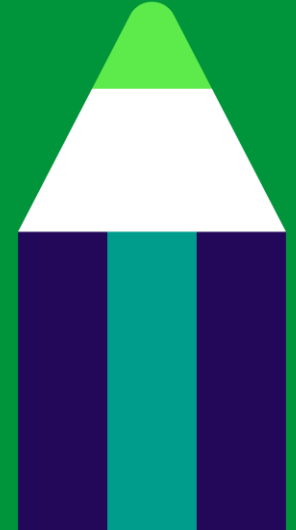

Global Collaboration Grants

Overview
of the call



About

- The Climate Skills Global Collaboration Grants will fund collaborative partnerships between the UK and Brazil, India, Indonesia, Mexico and Viet Nam to deliver **green work and green entrepreneurship experience and training** for marginalised young people aged **18 – 30 years**.
- Partners will work together to **skill share, develop opportunities** and provide the **financial support** to enable marginalised young people to undertake these.
- Applications must include **1 eligible UK organisation**, and at **least 1 eligible organisation from a partner country** (Brazil, India, Indonesia, Mexico, and Viet Nam).
 - In some countries – there are **pre-selected country partners**. This includes Indonesia (*INCREASE & AI Labs*) & Viet Nam (*CTU*).
 - Additional eligible local organisations in Indonesia and Viet Nam can work in a consortium with pre-selected partners (however, pre-selected partners will need to **lead**).
- Up to **£85,000** is available for each **partnership**.



Aims

- Foster strategic partnerships between UK institutions and Country Partner organisations.
- Promote cross-country knowledge exchange and innovation in youth green training and work pathways.
- Improve partner practice in training delivery, employer engagement and work placement models.
- Co-design and deliver green work experience or training for young people (18-30) in both the UK and partner country.
- Address barriers to the identified opportunities for marginalised young people.
- Strengthen networks and collaboration between the UK and Climate Skills countries to amplify collective impact and shared learning.
- Demonstrate pathways for sustaining training and activities beyond the grant period.



Eligibility Criteria

Partnerships:

Each proposal must have both:

- one HEI, TVET institute, FE College, Training Provider, or NGO based in the UK
- one eligible organisation from a Climate Skills partner country
- The proposal must be prepared jointly by both organisations but submitted by the UK Organisation.

Skill Development for Young People:

Opportunities to develop green work experience or training must be provided to young people in both the UK and in the partner country.

Meet GEM1 or GEM2 criteria:

All applications will need to demonstrate that they meet the [OECD-DAC gender equality policy markers](#) criteria for GEM1 or GEM2.

Capacity to deliver:

Partnerships must be able to manage the project funding available within the timelines given (19th Jan - Oct 2026).

Application deadline:

Applications must be submitted by 17th November 10:00 UK time



Assessment Criteria

- Relevance and Alignment (20%)
- Sustainability and Capacity Strengthening (10%)
- Experience, Capacity to Deliver and Resources (15%)
- Methodology (25%)
- Monitoring Evaluation and Learning (5%)
- Gender Equality and Social Inclusion (GESI) (10%)
- Budget (15%)



Application Process

- Email climate.skills@britishcouncil.org and attach your application and all supporting documents.
- Joint applications are required, and these must be submitted by the UK Organisation.
- All applications must be submitted by **10:00 UK time Monday 17th November 2025**.

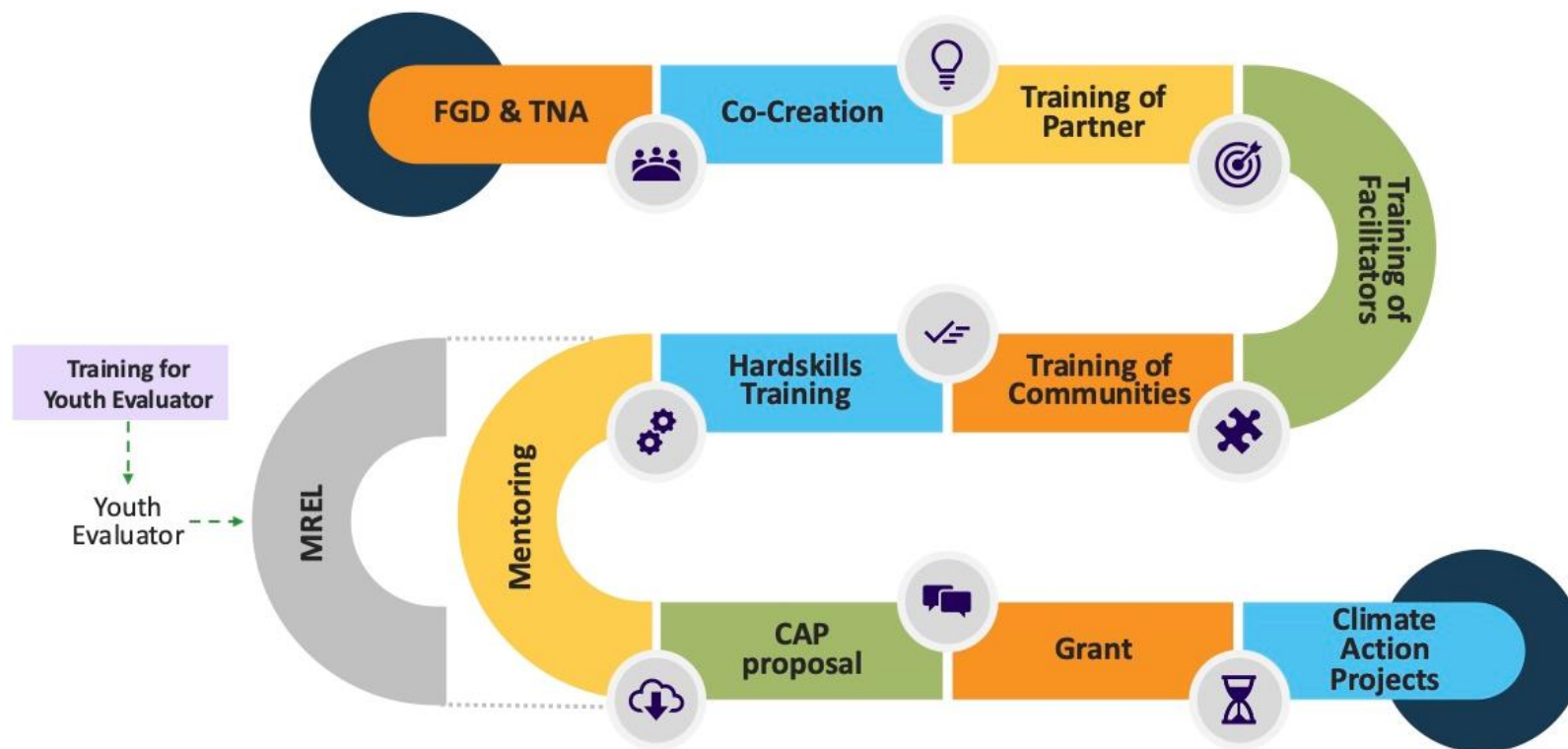

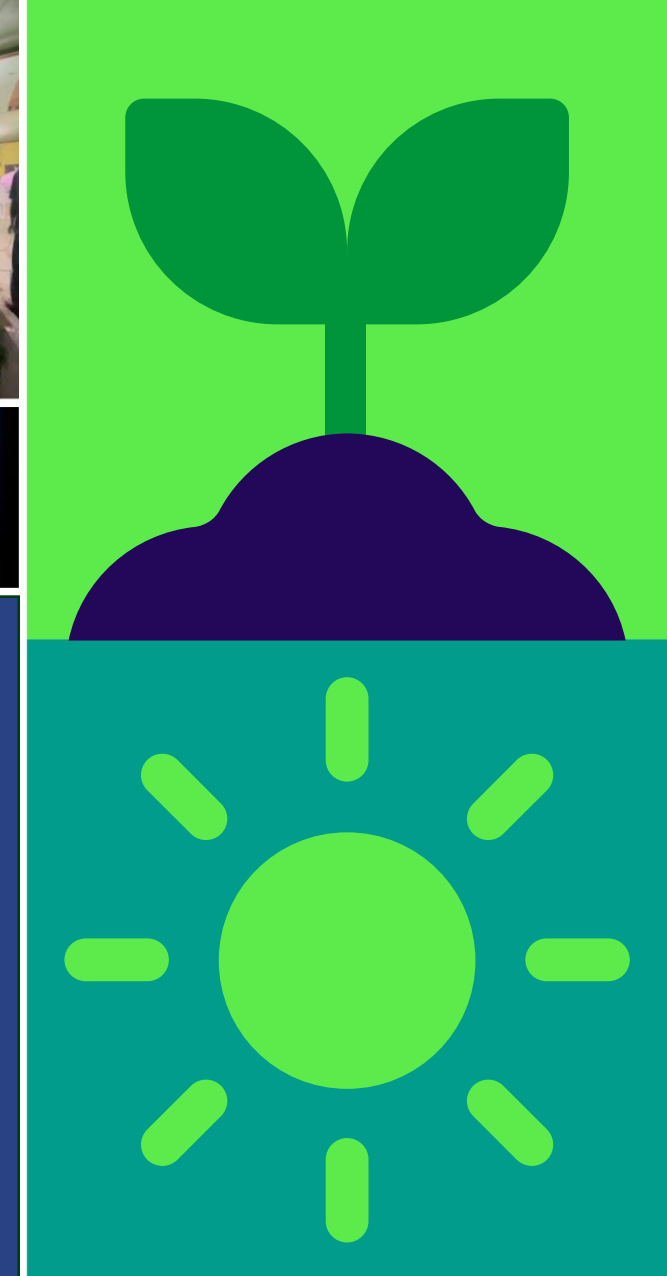

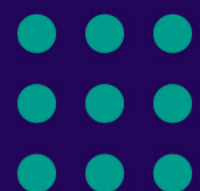

AI Labs Roles in Climate Skills Program

- Joined Master Facilitator Training-of-Trainers (ToT) program
- Designed the framework for a Climate Skills Training Needs Analysis in Indonesia
- Together with Increase, conducted the Training Needs Analysis and performed data processing
- Together with Increase, delivered a ToF (Training for Facilitator): capacity-building training for young facilitators
- Developed the mentorship curriculum for Climate Action Project Grantees

An intensive incubation program to develop digital social innovations addressing climate challenges. Delivered in **3** batches, involving **300+** organizations.

Organisation Overview

A distinguished academic unit playing a leading role as a sustainability engagement hub in education, training, interdisciplinary research, science-based policy advocacy, technology transfer, and innovation transformation across deltaic and river basin regions.

- Mission: The **LEAD** pillars – **L**earning (enhancing knowledge), **E**xcellence (fostering inclusive collaboration), **A**dvancement (bridging science and technology with community needs), and **D**evelopment (driving sustainable and inclusive growth)
- Vision: **RISE** pillars – conducting interdisciplinary **R**esearch, **I**ntegrating scientific and local knowledge, **S**upporting technical and policy innovation, and **E**ngaging diverse stakeholders in collaborative, multi-level action.
- Key activities and functions:
 - Two key research programmes on Governance and Sustainable Development and Production Ecosystem

Mekong Institute, Can Tho University, Viet Nam

Overview of Climate Skills experience

Mekong Institute has partnered with British Council VN in 2024 – 2026 to accomplish key expected outcomes regarding building up knowledge, skills and resilient capacity for marginalised young people on green transition and climate change adaptation in the Mekong Delta with following specific activities and achievement:

- Trained youths: **960** (including 420 females)
- Local delivery partners: **13** (7 governmental and 6 non-governmental organisations)
- Training of Facilitators (ToF): **5** (190 participants, including 88 females)
- Cascading trainings: **27** (770 participants, including 332 females)
- Social action projects (SAPs) guidance for submission: **63** projects; **2** funded projects
- Communications: **5** public events and two episodes of “Preparation for Life” broadcast on National Television



Mekong Institute, Can Tho University, Viet Nam

Areas of interest for the Climate Skills Global Collaboration Grants

1. International collaboration.
2. Training programmes.
3. Exchange of knowledge and best practice.
4. Development and implementation of pilot activities to promote capacity strengthening collaboration shaped by the demands and priorities of Viet Nam and the UK.

The Institute aims to co-develop approaches and framework towards providing training and professional bursaries to enable marginalised youths to undertake opportunities in green entrepreneurship and green work experience to young people. The initiatives should be involved in the areas of:

- Climate change
- Bioeconomy
- Social entrepreneurship
- Greenhouse gas emission reduction and carbon credit
- Nature-based solutions, among other priority environmental issues.
