1. The Warm Welcome Scholarship Scheme

HM Government

- Part of "Operation Warm Welcome" (announced by UK Government, September 2021)
- Aims to meet needs of different groups with links to Afghanistan in the UK to
 - rebuild lives
 - find work
 - pursue education
 - integrate with local communities
- Provides scholarships giving access to higher education.
- Government funding from the Department for Education (DfE).
- British Council is the delivery partner.

2. The scholarships

- 300 awards; 1 cohort; 2 programmes
 - In-Year scholarships (for current students)
 - Full Degree scholarships (for those commencing academic year 22/23)
- 3 levels of study
 - Undergraduate (3 years max or 4 years max in Scotland)
 - Taught master's (1 year max)
 - PhD (3 years max)
- Full-time, in-person study in the UK.
- Eligibility requirements include ARAP and ARCS schemes and Afghan British Nationals (see slide 9 for details)
- Prioritised programmes linked to employability or skills shortages (see slide 10 for details)
- Maintenance stipend funded by DfE; tuition fees waived by HEPs.

3. In Year Awards

- Up to 100 awards
- For scholars studying this academic year
- First stipend payment in June, back-dated to May
- Funding continues to the end of the course (max 2 further years, or 3 for undergraduates in Scotland)
- In Year scholars can not apply for Full Degree scholarship
- Simple application
 - Scholars apply to British Council
 - HEPs confirm eligibility and support for application
 - Awards made on first-come, first-served basis
- 2- week application window (9-20 May)

HEPs asked to inform eligible scholars and encourage their application

Interested scholars can register for alerts to keep informed

4. Full Degree awards

- Around 200 awards
- For scholars interested in commencing studies in academic year 22/23
- Two-stage application process
 - Scholars apply to participating HEPs and receive offer of place <u>and</u> sponsorship for Warm Welcome funding. (9 May 11 June)
 - Sponsored applicants complete scholarship application via British Council portal (27 June 8 July)
 - Following evaluation, allocations and confirmations with HEPs (by 13 August)
- Mid-Late August: HEPs sign grant agreements with British Council in time to receive and pay first stipends in Sept.

HEPs invited to participate, and to commit to waiving at least 6 years

Interested scholars can register for alerts to keep informed

5. Scholarship offers requested from HEPs

In-Year awards

- Commit support for scholars for duration of studies without conditions on their ability to pay tuition.
- Determine number of awards supported –not prioritising based on overall course length.

Full degree awards

- Waive tuition fees for agreed number of scholarships
- Requested to waive 6 years study in total (unless small or specialist institution in which case, 3 years)

Example distribution of scholarships

At least 2 PhD places

At least 3 taught master's PLUS at least 1 of either undergraduate or PhD place

At least 2 undergraduate places

6. Additional requirements for participation

- Designate one member of staff as single contact point with British Council
- Support Full Degree applicants in their selection of courses
- Confirm eligibility of applicants (In-Year, and Full Degree)
- Evaluate Full Degree applications received and confirm sponsored status of applications
- Act as point of contact with applicants to inform of application progress and success
- Review provisional allocations of scholarships prior to final award
- Ensure well-being support is in place for scholars throughout studies
- Manage scholarship stipends at quarterly intervals and report on scholar progress

7. Timelines

Promotion and Confirmation	ion of participation
25 Apr – 6 May	HEPs support with communication of the scheme to current scholars eligible for in-year scholarships
25 Apr – 6 May	HEPs confirm their participation for the new scholarship programme, including numbers of scholarship places that they can support
In-year scholarships	
9 May – 20 May	Application period for in-year scholarships
23 May – 3 June	 In-year scholarships confirmed with HEPs. HEPs sign agreements to confirm funding and receive payment of In Year scholar stipends.
By 25 June	In-year scholars receive first stipend payment from HEP (back-dated to application date)
New scholarships	
From 9 May – 11 June	Eligible applicants apply to HEPs
13 Jun – 25 Jun	• HEPs confirm offers to scholars and select to "sponsor" those that they would be happy to see awarded a scholarship.
27 Jun – 8 Jul	"Sponsored" scholars submit application to British Council
25 Jul – 13 Aug	new scholarships allocated and confirmed with HEPs
15 Aug – 31 Aug	HEPs sign agreements to confirm funding for scholars and receive stipend payments for first period.
From 5 Sep	New scholars receive first stipend payment from HEPs

8. Next steps

- 1. Register for <u>HEP alerts and updates</u>
- 2. Consider participation and number of scholarships. HEPs invited next week to indicate awards
- 3. Inform current eligible In Year scholars of upcoming application process (9-20 May)

- 4. Inform potential Full Degree scholars of awards and upcoming application process

9. Annex A – Eligibility requirements

Eligible scholars are those eligible for a university place that fall into the following categories

- Afghanistan Relocations and Assistance Policy (ARAP) resettlement route.
- Afghanistan Citizens Resettlement Scheme (ACRS) resettlement route
- Those with links to Afghanistan who are already registered at a UK university and are experiencing financial hardship and/or cannot return home due to the situation in Afghanistan.
- Afghan British Nationals (ABNs), described for these purposes as those that were evacuated during Operation Pitting <u>and</u> who entered bridging accommodation or who presented as homeless to a council, but hold British citizenship or some other status that permits them to remain and reside in the UK without the need to be granted leave to remain.
